

## **The Perennial Value of Bhakti Literature: A Case study of Sri Granth Saheb**

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The paper is an initial investigation into the perennial value of the Khakti literature with special referenced to Sri Guru Saheb (SGGS) taking into account its importance as a complimentary principle of meeting ground of different religions.
